

## **Traffic Patterns** (map is oriented to the north)

This diagram offers a general recommendation of preferred traffic patterns for rowers on Wequaque Lake. Note that weather conditions, especially wind velocity and direction, will impact these patterns. We most commonly row in a north-south pattern along the western side of the lake. If the wind is out of the north, we shift to an east-west pattern along the northern side of the lake. Keep these important safety measures in mind when out on the lake:

- Turn around and look where you are going at least every ten strokes. This includes looking to y our left and right for cross traffic. Be aware that the area that is hardest to see is what is directly in front of you.
- When rowing, know where you are and where other boats (including pleasure and fishing boats) and obstacles are at all times. Make note of how many other scullers and/or swimmers are out or headed out on the lake. Keep clear by steering away early.
- Row with another boat; it is strongly recommended that all rowers use the buddy system while rowing in singles. Stay close to shore.
- ◆ If rowing with others, do not row more than two boats abreast.
